Syllabus of Training Programmes

1. Making of The RFCTLARR Act, 2013

1.1. Overview of the history of land acquisition under the now- repealed Land Acquisition Act, 1894, its impact on affected population, legislative and judicial action at management of those impacts, philosophical basis of The RFCTLARR Act, 2013.

2. Understanding the socio-cultural, ecological environment of Project-Affected-People

- 2.1. Anthropological knowledge of tribes, their ecology-centric economy and society and the vulnerabilities resulting from these dependencies.
- 2.2. The economic, socio-cultural, ecological and natural resource arrangements of rural communities for a nuanced understanding of the disruptive effect of loss of land and livelihood.
- 2.3. Comprehending the experience of displacement by dalits and women, measures for their successful resettlement and rehabilitation

3. The RFCTLARR Act, 2013 and RFCTLARR Rules, 2014

- 3.1. Detailed analysis of the provisions of The RFCTLARR Act, 2013, insights into the rationale of the legal tenets, challenges to its implementation and future prospects.
- 3.2. Preparation of SIA report, preparation and implementation of SIMP and R&R Scheme and Development Plan. Attention will be focused on the substantive and procedural requirement of stakeholder identification, stakeholder consultation and consent generation, public reporting, monitoring and post implementation social audit.

A case-study approach shall be adopted for generating a collective understanding of the provisions and processes including the preparation of calculation matrix for compliance with the First, Second and Third Schedule.

3.3. The Safeguards Policies of multilateral funding agencies related to social impact assessment and rehabilitation of involuntarily displaced people will be discussed as an analogous template.
