Dr. M Aslam Alam is the Chairman and Executive Director of the Bangladesh Institute for Information literacy and Sustainable Development (BIILSD), which aims to building a hub for research, education, capacity development, outreach and advocacy equipped with diversified information and knowledge management tools, techniques, approaches and advisory services to enable informed and participatory policymaking for sustainable development at all levels.
