The scale of transformation that the energy transitions entail for the countries in Global South are very ambitious and would entail a path that has never been followed by other countries. And the key to the country's transition towards low carbon development including use of green hydrogen will be conducive government policies, actions by progressive businesses, international cooperation and access to green technologies and finance. For such countries, addressing climate change means bearing a massive cost to their economies, sacrificing their development to support a clean energy transition. The technology and finance required to decarbonise value chains and industrial processes remains concentrated in the Global North. In fact, the G20 has underscored the necessity of developed economies meeting their commitments on climate finance at previous COPs, exhorting them to scale up contributions from billions to the promised trillions.

The roundtable speakers shall share their perspectives on:

- What technologies hold the most promise for decarbonising industrial processes, and how can these be disseminated through the industrial base of the developing world?
- How can emerging and developing economies enter and move up the industrial supply chain for clean technologies?
- Interdependencies of low carbon, just transition plans across industry sectors
- Role for the financing community and impact investors
